Open access resources

- Open access to knowledge is a generic term used for knowledge resources made available in the public domain for public access or public consumption at large scale, without any hindrance of subscription fee or access charges.
- Open Access means, something that is FREE "Open access" is the term used to describe literature that is available to any reader at no cost on the Internet.
- It is part of a continuum ranging from completely closed, subscription/purchase only access to completely open, no barrier publishing.





Overview of OA publishing model

- Free digital content with no access barriers
- Copyright owner stipulates how content is used.







- Author pays Article Processing Charges Vs Subscription where reader pays
- Usually has an open button



Stipulate how to use the content using creative commons license









Why is the choice of journal important?

- A journal that will present your work in the best way possible
- Has impact on perception of the research quality
- Your reputation as a scholar
- Permanent access to the research
- The need to avoid publishing in a predatory journal
- ❖A journal with widest reach





Routes to OA Publishing

- ✓ Gold OA: Publish in OA Journal (DOAJ) or Hybrid Journal
 - Copyright owner is the author
 - Publisher PDF permanently and freely available
 - ❖APC applicable
 - ❖ Discounts and waivers: (EIFL) Electronic Information for Libraries
 - Institution and funder agreements eg Taylor & Francis
- ✓ Green OA: Archive a version of author manuscript in IR, website etc
 - Copyright with publisher
 - Archived version stipulated: SHERPA/RoMEO
 - Embargo period

Why open access?

- Visibility and Wider reach
- Free to share your work
- More discoverable: no access barriers
- Comply with funder requirements

Criteria for choosing a journal

Journal information found on Website as:

- Information for authors
- Publish with us
- About the journal
- Author resources
- Call for papers

NB: Instructions are journal specific







- Journal audience. Broad vs subject specific
- ❖Regional vs international?
- type of submission- empirical research, review paper, brief report, thought piece, book review, book chapter?
- Journals aims and scope





- Reputation of the journal
- Acceptance/rejection rates
- Quality of accepted articles
- ❖No of issues in a year
- ❖Turnaround time-
 - ✓ early cite, acceptance and publication





- **❖** Are there any article processing charges?
 - **❖**Article processing charges (APC) \$1,000 to \$5,000(EIFL)
 - **❖Elservier \$150 and \$9900 US Dollars**
 - EIFL negotiated APCs?
- **❖**Any waivers for developing countries?
 - ❖(Cambridge, Wiley, Taylor and Francis, Sage, OUP)

Journals with waivers/discounts (https://www.eifl.net)

- ❖Is the journal visible and accessible in our subscribed databases
- ❖Publication timelines how many issues a year?
- ❖Be realistic in your choice





- Indexing and Visibility? Scopus, Web of Science, Scimago? Pubmed, Medline, Google Scholar?
- ❖Is it indexed in discovery tools: Ebsco, ProQuest, WorldCat Discovery
- Read the peer review policy
- Review their sample papers
- Impact factor (Journal Citation Reports, Scimago, Source) Normalized Impact Per Paper(SNIP)
- Option for rapid publication?

Before sending your manuscript

- Good idea to do a cover letter
- One publisher at a time
- Obtain co-authors' consent
- Agree on authorship and order of author list
 - International Comm. Of Med. Journals editors
 - Harvard Medical School author guidelines
- ❖ Declare any conflict of interest
- Have plan B incase of rejection

- Proof read
- Check against author instructions
- Cover letter

What to expect after submission

- Accept
- Accept with minor revision
- Accept with major revision
- ❖ Reject





Why do articles get rejected?

- Mismatch between the manuscript and the journal aims and scope.
- Sent to the wrong journal
- Not aligned to author instruction
- Nothing new is found or stated
- Poor English and language-proof read



What are your options if rejected?

- Abandon the paper
- Send the paper with no review to another journal
- Review the reasons for the rejection and act
- Submit to another journal







Points to note in manuscript submission

- One publisher at a time
- Read and understand the publishing contract
- Corporate email
- Author list
- Researcher ID
 - ORCID Open Researcher and Contributor ID









Post publication: what next?

- Update your scholar profiles
- Upload in Institutional Repositories





Predatory journals defined

- Term coined by Jeffrey Beall
- Corrupt and exploit the author pay model i.e. Open Access
- Charges without providing request value addition services
 - Quality checks: Peer review, language editing, formatting etc
- False or misleading information: Indexing, Membership, IF
- Do not follow best practices in publishing

Signs of a predatory journal

- Does the journal promise more than it can reasonably deliver?
- Editorial or review board: credible, verifiable, qualification, affiliation, duplicate
- The publisher releases/starts with unrealistically large number of new journals
- Aggressive and indiscriminate solicitation of content
- Check website-contact information and general appearance
- Lack of transparency in Article Processing Charges (APCs)







Signs of a predatory journal cont...

- Little or no evidence of peer review and editorial services
- Guaranteed publication
- ❖Is it indexed by search engines?
- When you Google the title of the journal, is the first hit the journal website or a blog on why the journal is a fraud?
- Quick acceptance and publication
- Unrealistically broad coverage
- Quality of past issues







Signs of a predatory journal cont...

- Bealls list of predatory journals and publishers
 - https://beallslist.net/
- Cabell's list of predatory journals
- False or misleading information
- ❖If it claims to be indexed by a reputable database (e.g. ones from EBSCO, ProQuest, Thompson Reuters, etc.), verify
