

RSIF International Partner Institutions (IPIs)

- IPIs are universities, research institutes/centers or companies (public or private)
- Willing to develop close partnership with one or more African Host Universities (AHUs)
- Willing to host PhD sandwich opportunities 6 months to 2 years – to RSIF PhD scholars
- Open to work with AHUs to improve quality of relevant PhD programs
- Willing to work on collaborative research & innovation projects with AHUs



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Identification of prospective IPIs

- Prospective IPIs are identified through:
- Recommendations by key stakeholders, including the PASET Consultative Advisory Group (CAG), current IPIs and AHUs, existing international partners of AHUs, and World Bank.
- Search by the RCU-icipe based on identified needs for student attachments.
- A survey of top Universities/Research Centres/Companies that are working as leaders in their fields
 with a strong culture of research to innovation to find solutions to problems similar to those being
 addressed by RSIF scholars.
- An open call if necessary.


These are subject to a selection criteria and approval by RSIF management







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The RSIF Sandwich Program

• A requirement of the doctoral training that the scholar does some of the research work in an IPI




- Intended to provide a richer research experience
- Provide opportunities for research and training collaboration
- Provide access to State-of-the-Art research centres and universities
- Willing to prioritise African research challenges







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Initiating Sandwich Placement

- Research concept is well-defined
- Tentative Research Title proposed
- Search for a suitable IPI from those in partnership with PASET-RSIF (PASET-RSIF website)
- Use educational search engines (Google Scholar, Research Gate, etc.) to identify potential supervisor at the IPI
- Scholar and AHU supervisor reaches out to PASET-RSIF RCU to make the connection to the IPI potential supervisors
- RSIF makes the connection through the RSIF coordinator at the IPI
- Discuss concept/proposal with potential supervisor at IPI
- Formalize the matching with the IPI
- · Refine the research title and proposal



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RSIF Scholar matching process contd.



- Tripartite discussion initiated on email or meeting agreeing on modalities for the placement (research, logistics and cost)
- A tripartite agreement is drawn (if not already in place)
 - requires legal counsel review and input by partner institutions
 - Signed by institutional representatives


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Financial support for sandwich placement

- Research cost
 - some IPIs supplement research costs
- Return travel and visa
- Relocation allowance
- Living and accommodation expenses
- Medical insurance



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Placement dictated by IPI requirements or location

- Only faculty members
- Scholars placed in only in projects with research funding
- Type of visa e.g. UK 6 months
- · Cost of living

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Areas to consider in the process

- Tripartite agreement must be in place
- Type of visa may determine what scholar can access in terms of services in the IPI country:
 - o Accommodation
 - o Ability to open a bank account
 - o Ability to register a mobile phone line
 - o Level of taxation pegged on status
 - o Issuance of student/researcher ID by the IPI
- Carefully review institutional regulations/requirements for receiving visiting scholars
